Matt Johnston, President of California Aeronautical University (CAU) in Bakersfield, will be giving a presentation on "Building a Career in Aviation."

His talk about how to become an airline pilot or get into another career in aviation can be helpful to those of you interested in pursuing a career in aviation or if you know students who have that goal. I (Ceci) heard him speak at the AOPA Fly in at Livermore last year. He's great! Paula Sandling has asked him to be a speaker at the 998 Conference in July on the Queen Mary.

Matt emphasizes that students need to do a lot of research and make decisions even before they start flying!



Highlights of his presentation:

- Various ways to navigate your journey towards your goal in aviation
- Organizations that can help you
- Costs and various ways to build your career
- Choices (military, local FBO, flight academy, university partner with an airline)
- Certificates and ratings to get and in what sequence
- How to build time
- The difference between Part 61 and Part 141 flight schools
- When looking at flight schools/academies, etc., compare apples to apples regarding price vs. cost, avionics, time in training, what's included, geographics, pathway relationships
- ATP requirements
- Scholarships
- CAU options
