#### **OPPORTUNITIES** – *There is money out there!*

- Currently there is a desperate need for pilots, mechanics and other aviation professionals – despite the pandemic!
- By 2040 North America Needs
  - 612K new pilots
  - 626 K new maintenance technicians
  - 886 K new cabin crew
- More organizations, companies & individuals are donating money for scholarships

#### YOUR ACTION PLAN

- How to prepare for scholarships
  - Set your goals and timeline (Short-term & long-term plans)
  - Written goals are more likely to be achieved!
  - Define your "why"
  - Script your "elevator pitch"
  - Network everywhere, every day!
- SEARCH, SEARCH, SEARCH
  - Use resources mentioned in this presentation
  - What scholarships will help me reach my goals?
  - Build a scholarship plan (See Tip)

#### YOUR ACTION PLAN

- APPLY, APPLY, APPLY
  - Follow Tips for applying and completing scholarships
    - You'll have a better chance of winning
  - Know requirements & purpose of each scholarship
    - Ask "Am I eligible?"
  - Establish financial need (Explained later in this Power Point)
  - Follow Essay Tips
  - See Tips for reference letters
  - Don't recycle essays & letters!
  - Use personal resources such as a mentor
  - Update your plan as you move along

#### **OPPORTUNITIES** – Finding Scholarships

What scholarships might help me reach my goals?

- Break down your search by Categories
  - Flight Training
  - Technical fields/maintenance/avionics/other
  - Academic
  - Women or Youth
  - Specialty (e.g., helicopters, soaring)
  - Geographical areas

- Larger or well-known organizations
  - AOPA
  - 99s
  - EAA
  - Women in Aviation International
  - Women in Corporate Aviation
  - NBAA (plus local chapters)
  - GAMA

- Smaller or lesser-known organizations
  - OBAP
  - Ladies Love Taildraggers
  - Figure 1 Foundation
  - EAA Chapters (local)
  - 99s Chapters (local)
  - Able Flight (for disabled)
  - National Gay Pilots Assn (don't have to be gay)

- More Sources from Professional & Technical Organizations
  - Soaring
  - Experimental Aircraft
  - Maintenance
  - Air Traffic Controllers
  - Women's groups/Youth groups
  - Helicopters
  - Manufacturers
  - FAA
  - Etc.

- Non-Flying Sources Mostly Academic
  - Local service clubs (Lions, Rotary, Zonta, etc.)
  - Kohl's Department Store/Target/Others
  - Reagan Library Foundation
  - Grants/scholarships for future leaders and those pursuing a dream/those who've overcome obstacles
  - Manufacturers
  - Internships
  - Some are for astronaut training/camperships
  - Many are for STEM education

- What do reviewers look for?
  - Neatness, grammar, eligibility. Complete? On time?
     Financial need explained?
  - Involvement in aviation; volunteer work (Extremely important)
  - Realistic goal & plan?
  - Attached documents are clear & readable?
     (logs, medical, certificates, resume, etc.)
  - Is scholarship a good investment for the organization?
  - What is applicant's plan if they don't win?

#### HOW TO ESTABLISH FINANCIAL NEED

- Give a statement of income
- How much will it cost (without scholarship) to get the rating/certificate desired? (Identify the expenses – airplane, CFI, books, equipment, transportation, etc. & total)
- How do you budget income & expenses?
- Detail amounts you've saved, budgeted from income, have on loan, expect from gifts/overtime, etc.
- How will you fund your training other than with scholarships? (e.g., savings, additional job, roommate, overtime, gifts, lemonade & bake sales)
- Do other circumstances affect your need? (e.g., high cost of living area, high flight training cost, student loans, medical debt)
- What will you do if you don't get the scholarship? DON"T GIVE UP!

#### SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

- There is a lot of help out there! Go for it!
- "Don't leave money on the table!"
- Set your goals & make a plan (Short-term & long-term)
- Look at Opportunities & use Resources available
